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<b>Purpose and Content</b>	<p>Objectives of the Course To familiarize students with the sources of Islamic Law (Shari'ah) and the methodology of derivation of rulings for new issues in the realm of transactions, business and finance.</p> <p>To enable the students to have a modern approach to the present economic and finance problems in lights of the knowledge of the Principles of Islamic law;</p> <p>To equip the students with the ability to develop an Islamic Economic Methodology as a new alternative.</p> <p>Course Content This course is designed to cover the Principles of Islamic Jurisprudence ('Ilm Usul al Fiqh) based on the Quran and the Sunnah, which both constitute the sources as well as the subject-matter to which the methodology of Usul al Fiqh is applied. The course would discuss comprehensively other sources of methodology of Usul al Fiqh such as consensus (Ijma'), analogy (Qiyas), juristic preference (Istihsan) presumption of continuity (Istishab), public interest (Maslahah), and the rules of interpretation and deduction. It includes also to introduce Contemporary Fiqh Academies, SAC, OIC Fiqh Academy, and Modern Islamic Institutions on standardisation of rules such as OIC Fiqh Academy, AAOIFI, IFSB, etc.</p>

These include the contract of sale (bay') and its varieties, lease (ijarah), agency (wakalah), deposit (wadi'ah) loan (qardh), partnership contracts (musharakah and mudharabah), and security contracts such as pledge (rahn) guarantee (kafalah), transfer of debt (hawalah), absolution (ibra) and debt clearance (muqassah).</p>
