In doing this, the aim will be to examine socio-economic and socio -political relations as intertwined and not mutually exclusive, that is, considering social relations as internal relations. What will be emphasized in this course is to build our toolbox on concrete foundations that will help us understand social reality as a whole, through its historicity and relationality . In this context, classical political economy and critical political economy approaches, the emergence of capitalism and its transformation until today constitute the content of the course. The economic and political changes that occurred in this process will be examined in a relational and holistic manner.

The last weeks of the course focus on current debates about the state. Thus , this course aims to provide the student with the ability to analyze the state phenomenon from a historical and social perspective.

The policies followed by the Great Powers towards Turkey and their competition over Turkey during the collapse of the Ottoman Empire and the establishment of the Republic of Turkey , mainly between 1908 and 1923 . The main issues that confront the Great Powers and Turkey . The effects of the policies of the Great Powers on the collapse of the Ottoman Empire. Policies against the new Turkish state .

Purpose and Content	Throughout this course, the problems of state and nation building in the transition period of the fifteen states that declared their independence after the collapse of the Soviet Union will be discussed.
